



## POOL/SPA REQUIREMENTS AGREEMENT FOR CONTRACTOR AND HOMEOWNER

This document is to certify that all pool/spa ordinances and/or codes have been properly explained, in order to help prevent conflict at the finalization of your project. The rules regarding fence's or barrier requirements such as fence height and type should be understood. This also includes gate and opening requirements such as latches and closures. Additionally, household doors leading to pool areas and their alarm requirements should be fully understood. Inspection requirements, along with the policy on changes to plans, should be fully explained and understood prior to issuance of pool/spa permit.
